<b>Cognitive</b>	<p><b>Infants:</b> Hide small toys under cloth; stacking, dangling, and rattling toys; toy phones; busy box; rings on post</p> <p><b>Toddlers:</b> <u>Five Little Ladybugs</u> (with puppet); puzzles with knobs; foam blocks; kitchen items;; shape sorter</p> <p><b>Preschoolers:</b> "Garden Bugs" floor puzzle; "Find the Bugs" game; Monarch Butterfly life cycle;</p> <p><b>School Age Children:</b> "Find the Bugs" game; Monarch Butterfly life cycle; Fun facts about Monarchs</p>
<b>Physical: Small &amp; Large Motor</b>	<p><b>Infants:</b> Tummy time; mirror play; hold baby and dance to music; offer small toys to grasp</p> <p><b>Toddlers:</b> Dancing to music; ball play; unit blocks; playdough; shape sorter; large crayons with paper</p> <p><b>Preschoolers:</b> Music and movement; Twister; parachute; trains; puzzles; manipulatives; open-ended crafts</p> <p><b>School Age Children:</b> "Simon Says"; Twister; dancing to music; Lego building; puzzles; open-ended crafts</p>
<b>Social</b>	<p><b>Infants:</b> <u>Who Does Baby See?</u>; peek-a-boo; face-to-face with other infants or adult; soft doll play</p> <p><b>Toddlers:</b> <u>Making Friends</u>; tents and tunnel play; musical instruments parade; doll play; activity tower</p> <p><b>Preschoolers:</b> Doll house play; dressing in costumes; working in kitchen; doing laundry; board games</p> <p><b>School Age Children:</b> Board games; card games; Pet Clinic with stuffed animals; doll house play</p>
<b>Emotional</b>	<p><b>Infants:</b> <u>Baby's Feelings</u>; describe baby's feelings; mirror facial expressions; encourage exploration and play</p> <p><b>Toddlers:</b> <u>Guess How Much I Love You</u>; sing "When You're (emotion) and You Know It"; sensory bottles</p> <p><b>Preschoolers:</b> <u>I Feel (Emotion)</u> books; "Fly Like a Butterfly" yoga; butterfly breaths</p> <p><b>School Age Children:</b> <u>I Feel (Emotion)</u> books; "Fly Like a Butterfly" yoga; butterfly breaths; journal writing</p>
